BEACON Bioeconomy Research Centre is a Science Foundation Ireland Research Centre performing both blue skies and industry focused research to build and support the development of Ireland's bioeconomy. The Centre brings together a team of researchers from across a range of disciplines including biotechnology, systems and synthetic biology, chemistry, chemical and bioprocess engineering, agri-food, agriculture, animal and human nutrition, marine, business and social sciences. The centre represents a national collaboration between University College Dublin, Trinity College Dublin, Teagasc, National University of Ireland, Galway, University of Limerick and industry partners.

Project Details:

This PhD, contributing to the work of the *Knowledge Platform for a Sustainable Bioeconomy* will be hosted in the UCD School of Biosystems and Food Engineering. It will focus on theoretical development and application of sLCA for use with innovative and emerging bioeconomy supply chains and products, considering issues such as methodological choices, definition and prioritization of stakeholder groups, selection and interpretation of indicators, identifying and filling key data gaps and communication design. The candidate will work within the team to develop a modelling approach that can evolve with a technology from Technology Readiness Level (TRL) 1-3 up to TRL 7-9. The ideas will be tested 'in the field' using case studies of industry partners in the BEACON Centre.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Either BSc, BE, BAgSc (or equivalent in social science / humanities) 2.1 degree or MSc, ME, MAgSc (or equivalent in social science / humanities).
- Evidence of numeracy (mathematics and / or statistics)
- Knowledge of
 - agriculture or marine resources
 - biology
 - LCA
 - social impact
- Demonstrable interest in sustainable bioeconomy
